[Picasso and the Age of Iron](#) Basic Books

Co-founder and co-editor of October magazine, a veteran of Artforum of the 1960s and early 1970s, Rosalind Krauss has presided over and shared in the major formulation of the theory of postmodernism. In this challenging collection of fifteen essays, most of which originally appeared in October, she explores the ways in which the break in style that produced postmodernism has forced a change in our various understandings of twentieth-century art, beginning with the almost mythic idea of the avant-garde. Krauss uses the analytical tools of semiology, structuralism, and poststructuralism to reveal new meanings in the visual arts and to critique the way other prominent practitioners of art and literary history write about art. In two sections, "Modernist Myths" and "Toward Postmodernism," her essays range from the problem of the grid in painting and the unity of Giacometti's sculpture to the works of Jackson Pollock, Sol Lewitt, and Richard Serra, and observations about major trends in contemporary literary criticism.

Charles Baudelaire is usually read as a paradigmatically modern poet, whose work ushered in a new era of French literature. But the common emphasis on his use of new forms and styles overlooks the complex role of the past in his work. In *Grotesque Figures*, Virginia E. Swain explores how the specter of the eighteenth century made itself felt in Baudelaire's modern poetry in the pervasive textual and figural presence of Jean-Jacques Rousseau. Not only do Rousseau's ideas inform Baudelaire's theory of the grotesque, but Rousseau makes numerous appearances in Baudelaire's poetry as a caricature or type representing the hold of the Enlightenment and the French Revolution over Baudelaire and his contemporaries. As a character in "Le Poème du hashisch" and the *Petits Poèmes en prose*, "Rousseau" gives the grotesque a human form. Swain's literary, cultural, and historical analysis deepens our understanding of Baudelaire and of nineteenth-century aesthetics by relating Baudelaire's poetic theory and practice to Enlightenment debates about allegory and the grotesque in the arts. Offering a novel reading of Baudelaire's ambivalent engagement with the eighteenth-century, *Grotesque Figures* examines nineteenth-century ideological debates over

French identity, Rousseau's political and artistic legacy, the aesthetic and political significance of the rococo, and the presence of the grotesque in the modern.

Eye-opening and humbling, *Human Accomplishment* is a fascinating work that describes what humans at their best can achieve, provides tools for exploring its wellsprings, and celebrates the continuing common quest of humans everywhere to discover truths, create beauty, and apprehend the good.

Un matin de printemps en 1957, le photographe de terrain David Douglas Duncan se rend Cannes chez son ami Pablo Picasso, un de ses modèles favoris. Assis à côté du photographe, copilote de sa Mercedes Gullwing 300 SL, se trouve son fidèle compagnon, Lump. Bien que très attachés l'un à l'autre, le photographe et le teckel vivent mal leur existence à Rome. Le style de vie nomade du photographe est un problème et son autre chien, un lévrier afghan aussi jaloux que géant, tyrannise le teckel. Mais aujourd'hui est un jour magique. En arrivant à la villa de Picasso, Lump sait qu'il a

trouvé le paradis sur terre et qu'il emménagera avec le peintre que celui-ci le veuille ou non. Ce récit joyeux et jusque-là inédit de l'aventure du peintre et de son chien dresse un portrait particulièrement attendrissant de Picasso. Immortalisé sur une assiette peinte par l'artiste le jour de leur rencontre, Lump n'en était encore qu'à ses débuts. Ses ébats enjoués engendreront une explosion de 45 tableaux inspirés par le chef-d'œuvre de Velázquez, Les Ménines, mais le teckel y figurera à la place du chien impassible du premier plan. Aujourd'hui offertes par Picasso à la ville de son enfance, ces œuvres lumineuses représentent le clou d'une visite au musée Picasso de Barcelone. Quatorze sont reproduites ici en couleurs aux côtés de photos noir et blanc de moments intimes dans la vie du peintre et de son chien. Ainsi, la boucle est bouclée, clôturant l'odyssée du teckel solitaire qui parcourut un long chemin depuis la Mercedes 300 SL pour devenir une icône de l'art du nouveau millénaire, au poil soyeux et au corps sans fin.
